Mental Illness in the Church

May is Mental Health Awareness Month. That we need to designate a month to raise greater awareness of this issue certainly seems justifiable. Today we face a serious mental health crisis that is spreading across our nation, as well as around the world. In recent years, we have witnessed a staggering increase in the numbers of those who are afflicted with anxiety, depressive, and substance use disorders. Levels of persistent sadness, hopelessness, and suicidal tendencies have risen sharply, especially among young people. The National Institute of Mental Health has estimated that nearly 58 million people in the United States suffer from mental illness, almost a quarter of whom struggle with what can be classified as a severe case. The problem is compounded by the social stigma that still attaches to the disease. Many people are too overcome by embarrassment, shame, or guilt to reach out for the help they need.

Mental illness is no respecter of persons, including those within the church. But we in the church are in a position to respond constructively to it. Tom Karel, counselor and author of A Christian's Guide to Mental Illness, urges us to be attentive to those in our congregations who may be struggling with mental illness. How can we help the one who struggles? Karel suggests five ways. First, we show up and be present to him. We listen carefully to him in our conversations, asking thoughtful questions that draw him out. Second, we remember that the one before us is a person. She is not her diagnosis, her past, or what family and friends say about her. She especially is not a label that popular psychology pastes on people like her. She is a person made in the image of God, by God and for God. All other distinctions pale into insignificance. Third, we socially connect that person with others who can help him feel less alone in his pain. Fourth, we encourage her to get involved in activities in the church. Of course, this way applies especially to those in larger congregations, where more opportunities for involvement exist. Finally, we encourage him to read the Bible. In the Bible he will find words of comfort, assuring him that God is close to the broken-hearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit (Psalm 34:18).

Mental health, like all aspects of health and well-being, matters to us in the church. Let us be sure that we play our part in providing help and hope to those who struggle with mental illness.

Contrary to common perception, Jesus' disciples weren't frightened and hiding during the 10 days between Ascension and Pentecost. Instead, they were actively preparing for the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. They "all joined together constantly in prayer" (Acts 1:14, NIV) and took steps to replace Judas.

After that inward focus, the disciples were ready to boldly burst forth on Pentecost, empowered and "enabled" (Acts 2:4) by the Spirit. They proclaimed Christ's death and resurrection, leading 3,000 people to faith that day, now known as the church's birthday.

"A great wave of faith and love swept through this newborn community," writes Suzanne de Dietrich in *Free Men.* "These Christians could not keep silent. Their joyful liberty had broken down all the walls behind which people would like to keep them; no prison could silence them."
